I want to personally express my gratitude and give thanks to your congregation for faithfully paying 100% of your apportionment covenant in 2023.

Because of the commitment, faithfulness, and sacrifice demonstrated by your congregation, the Western Pennsylvania Annual Conference was able to continue making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. Alongside other congregations, you have supported new ministries, provided resources for both clergy and laity of all ages, and exemplified the love of Jesus Christ. Your gifts have blessed our United Methodist connection and have strengthened vital ministry and mission.

In 2023, your Conference staff and leadership focused on building our United Methodist connection, equipping church leadership, and supporting mission near and far. We embraced our connection by hosting the triconference educational event "Level Up" to resource congregations that are looking to reach new people in new ways. Participants included those that have been doing the work of congregational revitalization with the support of the Conference. Our global partnerships continued to thrive as we welcomed leaders from Zimbabwe for a reverse immersion experience and supported ongoing mission projects around the world. When disaster struck East Palestine in early 2023, the Mission Barn was able to immediately support those affected by distributing over 300 cleaning kits.

Recognizing the challenges faced by those in cross-racial/cross-cultural appointments, we hosted a retreat for racial-ethnic clergy, key leaders from racial-ethnic churches and churches served by racial-ethnic clergy. This was an opportunity for participants to build and make connections, while gaining practical insights into creating greater congregational vitality. Additionally, we continued to uplift our youth through Spark and confirmation events led by Conference program staff, and provided hands-on opportunities for youth to support local communities in mission.

With God's grace, together we can do abundantly more than we ever could alone. Your commitment through apportioned giving makes you an invaluable part of our connectional ministries and we celebrate your faithfulness. I give thanks for the ministries we have supported and the disciples being made because of your congregation. Praise be to God!

#### **Christmas Projects**

This year, in lieu of collecting gifts for Operation Christmas Child, our church will be collecting gifts for 2 projects, one local and one in Pittsburgh.

Our local project will be to collect items to help the school nurses in our area.

The other project is to help those served by the United Methodist Church Daily Bread project. We have become connected to this project by providing meals to those individuals.

We would now like to support them with other items (clothing, toiletries, etc.).

More details about the types of items needed will be published in the October newsletter and in the bulletin. We will be begin collecting these items in October.

#### **Hunger Action Month**

Many of you are aware that we partner with the Second Harvest Program in Erie. Through them we purchase grocery items of all varieties on a monthly basis. We never know until we look at their order book online as to what is available. However, there is always enough variety to satisfy the fourteen categories that we display in our "Shop By Choice" merchandising in our dining room. On August 21 we filled 92 orders, representing 200+ household members in their dwellings. We had an applicant in his mid 30s with zero income. We had an applicant who lived with a man who was soon to be put in jail. She had zero food for her or her child. These are tough situations, but these challenges are typical of the neighbors and visitors who we see on a monthly basis. It breaks our heart, but they need us. Compassion, kindness, safe sanctuary, love, and yes, food and supplies are what they receive from this loving church.

So, sharing this information leads to our special emphasis of "Hunger Action Month," which is being promoted by Second Harvest of Erie. Focusing on one concept for the month, we are going to put on a drive to promote the supplying of laundry detergent to help our visitors free up some of their funds for food. On the last Sunday of September, we would like to display all of the laundry soap that is brought in, including the detergent that is bought with the funds that are contributed through September 25. These items will be seen at the front of the sanctuary for our combined 9:30am service on September 29.

How do you go about supporting this ACTION MONTH? Three primary ways:

- (1) Through your e-giving you can choose to assign your gift to Love Cupboard.
- (2) Through your envelope you can assign your gift to Love Cupboard.
- (3) Place your laundry detergent on the table in the Gathering Area. It is highly recommended you use the present procedure of buying the laundry detergent at Dollar Tree or Dollar General. Their product selection is of reasonably good quality and more economical than that of the larger markets.

You can and do make a significant difference in the lives of the neighbors who visit monthly to our Love Cupboard Food Pantry. This mission program is going on right in the basement of our church. We distribute approximately 3,000lbs of goods a month.

The donation item for the month of **September** is **Laundry Detergent**. Please place your donations in the wooden box located in the Gathering Area.

#### **Our First Family Comes to The Refuge**

A young mother and her eleven-year-old son have moved into the room we sponsor at the Erie United Methodist Alliance's (EUMA) homeless shelter where Pastor Jodie met them shortly after their arrival. Both are thankful for the safety and security that The Refuge provides. They were grateful to receive a freshly furnished room, school supplies to start the new year, and a gift bag of snacks and drinks. On Tuesday, August 6, eight members from our Missions Committee and the church spent the day visiting The Refuge and volunteering at the EUMA's Rainbow Connection Thrift Store, where we sorted and hung nine bins of donated clothing—a record we were told. Our church was enthusiastically invited to come back anytime.

The room at The Refuge badly needed additional furnishings to make it more comfortable and user friendly, especially lighting, work space, and additional storage. To that end, a trip to two household supply stores in Erie garnered a desk, chair, two lamps, storage containers and several smaller items. In addition, donations from The Caring Tree were left for the family.

Many opportunities remain to help this family and those who follow. As one family moves out, another comes in. The room we sponsor will never be vacant for long.

Over the coming year, covered by our sponsorship, the Missions Committee will provide updates on the parents and children staying in our room. As holidays approach, ideas will be presented for ways the congregation can reach out to the family in residence.
