The story below is not new, but I think it's worth repeating if you've heard it before.

A church-goer wrote a letter to the editor of a newspaper and complained that it made no sense to go to church every Sunday. He wrote:

"I've gone for 30 years now, and in that time, I have heard something like 3,000 sermons, but for the life of me, I can't remember a single one of them. So, I think I'm wasting my time; the preachers and priests are wasting theirs by giving sermons at all."

This statement started a real controversy in the "Letters to the Editor" column. Much to the delight of the editor, it went on for weeks until someone wrote this clincher:

"I've been married for 30 years now. In that time my wife has cooked some 32,000 meals. But, for the life of me, I cannot recall the entire menu for a single one of those meals. But I do know this: They all nourished me and gave me the strength I needed to do my work. If my wife had not given me these meals, I would be physically dead today. Likewise, if I had not gone to church for nourishment. I would be spiritually dead today!"

- Faith sees the invisible, believes the incredible & receives the impossible!
- Thank God for our physical and our spiritual nourishment!
- ◆ IF YOU CANNOT SEE GOD IN ALL, YOU CANNOT SEE GOD AT ALL!
- B.I.B.L.E. simply means: Basic Instructions Before Leaving Earth!

#### What is Food Insecurity?

Being without reliable access to a sufficient quantity of affordable and nutritious food at any given time.

People experiencing food insecurity may be unsure of where their next meal will be coming from and/or the next time they will be able to eat. Many factors can contribute to a person being food insecure, and they are not always easy to see. It could be that a person is having trouble securing affordable housing, or they may have debt or unpaid bills from uncovered medical expenses and more. Factors like these take a higher priority over a person's next meal. Aside from the affordability of food, those who are food insecure may not have physical access to real, healthy food.

Some common barriers are reliable transportation and distance to a grocery store with wholesome foods. Many of us take for granted how accessible real, healthy food might be, but for some being food insecure is a common reality. It is possible for many to be at risk, even people you know. Food insecurity is a reality for millions and a risk for many more citizens in our country. The next question is, what can we do to help? This is where we step in to do our very best for our "neighbors" who come to our Love Cupboard Food Pantry. We presently are hosting about 85 to 95 visiting our church monthly with the need for food, cleaning aids, and some health and beauty aids. Your support of this endeavor goes a long way toward helping each of them. We can always use volunteers to help serve their needs. This could be clerical checking in, helping them with their "shopping by choice," unloading trucks, picking up extra items locally, etc. I thank each and every one involved in this mission ministry program.

### **Love Cupboard Food Pantry July 2024**

Weather was a factor for our neighbors who visited on the third Wednesday of July. We ended up with 66 households visiting, which represents 164 household members. It is important to note that we have started a Loyalty Program. To achieve this status, the visitor must have an attendance record of 3 visits out of the last 5 months. We are up to 95 Loyalty neighbors. Each of these visitors has an exact time to arrive for their SHOP BY CHOICE shopping list. This program has dramatically helped the large influx of visitors at the beginning of the starting time. Less congestion, better flow of shopping pattern, and easier check-in procedures are part of the gains we are experiencing.

As we continue to refine the efficiency of the pantry operation, we have been able to change the trucking schedule to improve on the time element between receiving perishables and the distribution date. This alone will save approximately \$1,500 in milk cost for the balance of 2024. Yes, that calculates at \$3,000 a year at the present cost of milk. Each ½ gallon we receive from Second Harvest comes to us at no cost. We continue to have volunteers step forward to assist in the unloading of trucks and the distribution of goods. We are now entertaining the use of some of our neighbors who come monthly to assist in our guest shopping experience. The feeling of helping neighbors in need is very gratifying. Volunteers stepping forward exceeds our expectations. As you know, it is easier to give than receive, but it feels great with all the support we are getting.

<u>Please Note</u>: Perishable items are now available. Distribution occurs on the 3rd Wednesday of each month from 4:00pm-5:30pm.

On **Tuesday, August 6** the Missions committee will have a road trip to Erie United Methodist Alliance (EUMA) in Erie. The greatest need for help is in the Rainbow Connection Thrift Store where many donations need to be sorted and hung. Through the thrift store, EUMA collaborates with 45 nonprofit organizations to serve hundreds of local families. Last year they issued more than 1,700 vouchers.

We will also visit *The Refuge* to see the room our church is sponsoring and perhaps meet its current residents—a mother and her ten-year-old daughter. We will decide how we wish to paint, decorate and supply it. Transportation will be provided. We will depart from the church parking lot at 8:30am and return late afternoon. We'll stop for dinner to debrief on our visit to *The Refuge* and share ideas for this project. If you are interested in joining us, please let us know in the church office (814-226-6660).

#### Finance at a Glance

Over the next several newsletters I want to attempt to teach, clarify, and encourage each person's stewardship commitments to our church. It starts with understanding the four layers of funds and giving to the First United Methodist Church. I will review the General Fund which supports each area of ministry under the General Budget umbrella. The other three layers are Capital Funds, Designated Activity Funds, and United Methodist Foundation Funds (future articles will address each of these funds).

We give our stewardship funds to the General Fund to help our church meet its obligations of the prepared budget for 2024. The giving methods established are individual envelope assignment, by check, by cash/ loose money given in the offering, and by electronic giving (e-giving). These forms of giving are the ways in which you help fund the cost of enabling our ministry budget. This part of the budget is comprised of expenditures (expenses) that I will attempt to explain as well as share our views. We have five primary groups of expenses presented below. The percent (%) represents the ratio of this category to total expenses.

<u>Annual Conference Mission Share</u> is commonly referred to as Benevolence - 10.6% of total expenses.

<u>Programming</u> includes Church Council, Music Ministry, Christian Education, Membership, Worship - 1.5% of total expenses.

<u>Property</u> includes Church Utilities, Church Maintenance, Property Taxes, Custodial Supplies, New Equipment/Improvements, Parsonage Maintenance, Technology, Insurance, Parsonage Utilities, Annual Contracts - 18.3% of total expenses.

**Salary** includes our pastor and support staff - 56.4% of total expenses.

<u>Administrative</u> includes Pastor expenses, Lay Employee Social Security, Workers' Compensation, Stewardship, Finance Committee, Church and Office supplies, Pension, Hospitalization, Communications - 13.1% of total expenses.

#### Total budgeted expenses = \$412,948 for 2024

Each of us owns a home or rents, and we have living expenses that we need to control to match the income potential that we have. The church is not different. Our church income does not flow the same way your personal income flows, but over the period of twelve months, the income needs to be equal to or more than the expenses incurred.

This is where each of us enters in. Our tithes and offerings are super important to FUMC Ministry. The <u>daily</u> <u>expense</u> cost of our ministry budget is <u>\$1,100</u>. Yes, you read that right. Now is the time to direct your contributions properly to keep every layer of ministry in place and growing.

<u>God is good all the time, all the time God is good</u>. Working together will eliminate the deficit we are experiencing against projected budget income receipts.

As is the case with everything else in our world that is going up in price, so is the cost of paper, ink, postage and machine maintenance.

In order to reduce some costs of operation for the church, I will not be doing a mass mailing of the semi-annual Statements of Giving Report this year. The Annual Statement of Giving Reports will of course be prepared and mailed in January.

If anyone desires to receive said report before January, please notify me or Darren Mackenzie. Darren will advise me of the request and I will prepare a report and deliver it to the requester.
