

Love Cupboard 2024 Summary

As we move into a new year, I find it important to review and evaluate what took place in 2024. It is important to first recognize each and every volunteer and activity performed. It takes people in place in many layers to create the success of our Love Cupboard and Senior Food Box programs. These layers include ordering, shopping, truck unloading, stocking display carts, administrative duties, delivery persons, servers, hostess duties, check-in station, etc. Each day that we have a distribution of goods to our neighbors in need, we have from 15 to 18 volunteers performing duties with kindness, courtesy, and caring hearts. On a typical Love Cupboard distribution day, we handle 1½ to 2 tons of goods leaving the church. Our records show that we had almost 500 shifts of work performed. These shifts totaled up to approximately 1,300 hours of work duties. I use the word "work," but it truly is an act of love and compassion that each hour is served.

During the Covid months several years ago, we were serving 30 to 40 households. We finished the last quarter of 2024 averaging 85 to 95 households. The total household members who are being affected each month amount to 200 to 225. The consistency of what we do and how we do our monthly preparation and serving have been the fundamental reasons for the significant growth we are experiencing. When each guest comes in to our Love Cupboard distribution, they know they are going to get milk, bread, eggs, frozen protein items, and selections of nine more categories. We continue to use a shopping guideline of goods to be received that vary according to household size. This process is referred to as "Shopping by Choice" and continues to be well received. We have approximately 30 different volunteers at this point and are always open to more persons stepping forward. Activities occur at different time through the month and the distribution of our Love Cupboard program happens each third Wednesday of the month from 2:30 to 5:00pm.

The GBHEM Scholarship Portal Is Now Open

The General Board of Higher Education and Ministry (GBHEM) scholarship application portal is open for United Methodist students seeking scholarships for undergraduate and graduate study at colleges, universities and seminaries in the United States. Potential scholarships awarded range from \$500 to \$1,200, on average.

In 2024, GBHEM awarded more than 2,100 scholarships, valued at nearly \$3.7 million, to undergraduate and graduate students at 509 U.S. schools. This financial aid helped students of all backgrounds pursue their dreams and education to serve as the next generation of leaders.

The Scholarships Office administers more than 70 scholarship programs with one general application. Students may submit one application per year, which will be screened for the appropriate scholarship program.

2025 Plans for the Caring Tree in Wesley Chapel

Last year our church launched the Caring Tree Program to help people in our community meet a variety of needs. During the past holiday season, we donated gifts of toys and warm clothes to children through Pennies from Heaven to make their Christmas brighter. We collected over 550 food items to help 100 students in the C-L Backpack Program who have too little to eat at home over the weekends. Every month this year we are collecting for a different organization to help their clients. The first half of 2025 is as follows:

January: The Shelter Task Force is an organization that assists the homeless and those at risk of becoming homeless in Clarion.

February: The Ruth M. Smith Center is a personal care home for adults with special needs in Sheffield, PA. **March:** The Mission Barn, an UMCOR relief organization in New Castle, needs items for hygiene kits distributed to people in disaster areas.

April: SAFE (Stop Abuse For Everyone) provides emergency help and services to victims of domestic abuse in Clarion.

May: Next Step Pregnancy Solutions & Services provides crisis counseling, education, and assistance to women facing unexpected pregnancies.

June: The Clarion Kindness Project manages a Diaper Bank for moms in the Clarion area who stop by their office for diapers and infant hygiene products.

At the upcoming February 18 Missions Committee meeting, the team will select six organizations for the second half of the year (July-December). An announcement of the new list will be posted in an upcoming newsletter.
